


01 INTRODUCTION





Kyiv is the capital of Ukraine, one of the largest and most ancient cities in Europe, the political, economic, administrative and spiritual center of Ukraine.



- Predictive data according to the Kyiv Social and Economic Development Program for 2016
- 2 According to EIU Global Liveability Ranking 2015.
- Average nominal wages by types of economic activity as of September 2016 (latest available data).
- Long-term credit rankings of Kyiv for liabilities in foreign currency as of 01.10.2016. The ranking values of all agencies belong to the speculative class and indicate difficulties in fulfilling debt obligations. The forecasts by Standard & Poor's and Fitch is negative, that by Moody's is stable.

The Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025 is the main regulatory document that determines the goals and objectives of the city's long-term development.



The first version of the Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025 was approved by the Resolution of the Kyiv City Council No.824/7060 dated December 15, 2011.



The Strategy determined the conceptual **vision of the future image** of Kyiv until 2025, the main **strategic initiatives and priorities** of the long-term development of Kyiv, as well as **the sectors of the city economy.**



The development process of the first version of the Kyiv Development Strategy until 2025 involved a wide range of the leading core experts, analysts, statesmen, activists and community of the city in general.



The most important principle of the Strategy is the ability to measure the results achieved.

The need of having a new version of the Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025 can be explained by modern socio-economic realities and a recently updated regulatory framework.

Prerequisites for preparing a new version of the Strategy:



The first version of the Strategy does not comply with the requirements of the recently adopted regulatory documents related to the process of strategic planning of local development, in particular:

- The Law of Ukraine "On the Principles of the State Regional Policy"
- Procedure for Elaborating Regional Development Strategies and Action Plans for Their Implementation, as well as the Monitoring and Evaluation of the Effectiveness of Implementation of These Regional Strategies and Action Plans, approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine No. 932 dated 11.11.2015



The first version of the Strategy has **insufficient interconnection and should be harmonized with the provisions of current state documents** of a strategic nature, namely:

- Ukraine-2020 Sustainable Development Strategy approved by the Decree of the President of Ukraine No. 5/2015 dated 12.01.2015
- State Strategy for Regional Development until 2020, approved by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine No. 385 dated 06.08.2014



The first version of the Strategy needs to be revised in accordance with the current socio-economic realities and requirements of the society:

- To date, part of the strategic priorities is non-topical due to the significant change in the socio-economic situation in the country and the limited resources for their implementation
- A number of urgent socio-economic problems that have arisen in recent years were provided for in the first version of the Strategy and require an immediate solution
- Some target indicators determined in the first version of the Strategy need to be revised as they can be neither tracked not calculated (statistical observation have not been not conducted or have been conducted only once)



The processes of **strategic planning** of the city development **and its operational activities should be harmonized**:

The first version of the Strategy does not fulfil the role of the benchmark for coordinating the actions of all participants in the city's social and economic relations during the planning of their operational activities (when making programs of socio-economic development, annual budgets and urban targeted programs)









Over the past year, Kyiv residents' confidence in the correctness of the direction of the city development has significantly decreased.

The use of the provisions of the first version of the Strategy (as of 2011) as a fundamental basis for the preparation of a new version, which will be revised in the light of current priorities and requirements


A new version of the Strategy should aim at maximizing of consideration the of the actual interests of all stakeholders, with the priority of the needs and interests of the residents of Kyiv

A new version of the Strategy should be the source document for the development of the medium-term and short-term plans and programmes of the development of Kyiv





The Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025 02 New Version of the Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025



By 2025, Kyiv has to become closer to the developed Eastern European capitals by the level of economic development and comfort of the residents.

Substantiation of the strategic goals of Kyiv:

- Today, Kyiv continues to lag far behind other Eastern European cities by the level of Gross Regional Product (GRP) per capita
- The State Regional Development Strategy Until 2020 provides for the annual growth of the GRP of Kyiv (per capita) on average by ~7%⁴
- Support for these growth rates is quite realistic in the long run, so the administration of Kyiv sees a task to ensure the GRP growth per capita in Kyiv by ~2 times until 2025⁵
- International rankings are an important tool for positioning Kyiv on the international scene and allow to objectively assess the level of competitiveness of the city compared to 3 other cities
- The ranking of **WB Doing Business** is one of the leading international indexes that characterizes the conditions for doing business in the country
- Taking into account the fact that the Ukraine-2020 Sustainable Development Strategy identified the goal of reaching the position in TOP-30 by 2020,a study of the indicator, according to the WB methodology is carried out in Kyiv, the city authorities are tasked with ensuring the achievement of the target
- Needs and interests of residents Kyiv are crucial in shaping the long-term vision of the city's development
- The comfort of life in Kyiv, which is determined by the possibility of providing residents with a high level of service in all key areas of the city's life, has a significant potential to increase compared with similar cities in Eastern Europe
- Given the fact that compared to 2011, the adapted composite index of the comfort of life increased by only 6% (with a target value of + 21%) in 2015, it is clear that the main work towards improving the comfort of living of Kyiv residents is ahead
- For the objective characterization of the level of comfort of life in Kyiv, an independent (external) index of the comfort of life(EIU Global Liveability Ranking) is used along with estimated (internal) index of the comfort of life.
- Due to the deterioration of the overall socio-economic situation in Kyiv, its positions in the EIU ranking, which characterizes the comfort of life in the city, substantially deteriorated in the period of 2011-2015(from the 91st in 2011 to 132nd place in 2015 out of 140 cities of the world)
- By 2025, Kyiv plans to enter the TOP-50 cities of the world by the level of suitability for life
- Kyiv is the capital of Ukraine, one of the largest and most ancient cities in Europe
- The historical and cultural identity of Kyiv has been formed for many centuries, which confirms the necessity of its preservation and development taking into account the requirements of the time
- According to a survey conducted by the Rating Sociological Group on behalf of the International Republican Institute (IRI)³ in March 2015, only 54% of Kyiv residents are clearly proud of their city, while among the top three of the leader cities this figure exceeded 70%
- Kyiv has a significant number of objects of historical and cultural heritage, which are a kind of hallmark of the capital and are widely known outside of Ukraine.
- Positioning of Kyiv in such international rankings as Euromonitor Top 100 City Destinations Ranking is extremely important in terms of popularizing Kyiv's identity in the international arena
- By 2025, Kyiv plans to realize its unique potential and enter the TOP-50 cities of the world in the Euromonitor Top 100 City Destinations Ranking





Volume of cumulative foreign direct investment (FDI) in the economy of Kyiv (at the end of the year)




Share of the largest investor countries in the economy of Kyiv




TRENDS AND MAIN PROBLEMS OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF KYIV:

Due to the complication of socio-economic conditions in Ukraine, the situation in the labour market in Kyiv has significantly deteriorated in recent years, which requires the city to pursue a balanced and consistent policy aimed at supporting employment and creating conditions for wage growth.




Economically active population of Kyiv at the age of 15-70




Nominal average monthly salary

Despite the constant growth of nominal wages in Kyiv (14% - the average annual growth rate for 2011-2015), in the recent period there is a significant decrease in its real values. In addition, the negative gap between the availability of vacancies and the number of registered unemployed increases. Under such conditions, Kyiv, in addition to developing the economic base for creating additional labour demand (sector 1.1), aims at creating additional favourable conditions for the growth of the level of employment and official wages in Kyiv.




Unemployment rate of the population aged 15-70 (using the ILO methodology)





Number of incompleted buildings and engineering structures









Revenue to the city budget from the sale of land





Today, the vast majority of public utilities infrastructure in Kyiv needs modernization due to the high level of wear.

In recent years, there has been a tendency towards a reduction in the consumption of resources (electricity, water and heat) due to a number of factors, in particular, the reduction of production activity and the introduction of accounting.



Despite the considerable potential of housing cooperatives as a tool for monitoring the quality of public utility services, the rates of creation and overall assessment of their activities in Kyiv remain low.

Modernization of existing and building new infrastructure:






Degree of wear of cable lines 0.4-1 10 kV and heating systems






Degree of wear of the Desnianska and the Dniprovska water intake plants






Share of budget expenditure of Kyiv for physical culture and sports in total expenditures of the budget of Kyiv





Number of population of Kyiv covered by all types of physical culture and health-improving work














In recent years, the level of pollutant emissions into the air in Kyiv has decreased to ~ 170 thousand tons, ~ 85% of which was formed by mobile sources.







Emissions of pollutants into the air for the year

Over the past years, the list of administrative services provided via the Administrative Services Centers (ASCs) in Kyiv has considerably expanded, which has become, among other things, one of the factors in increasing the demand for such services among the city's residents.




In 2015, due to the increase in the number of administrators of the ASCs, it was possible to reduce the load on employees by 44%, but the achieved level is still three times higher than the optimal one.




Load level for one administrator of the ASC

TOP-5 regions of Ukraine according to the results of the EIT in the Ukrainian language and literature: share of people with the scores of 180-200¹










An urgent problem in the educational sphere of Kyiv is the increase in the load on educational establishments, in particular due to children of internally displaced persons from areas of the ATO and Crimea, migration processes, housing construction, etc.




Number of grave crimes committed in Kyiv (cases)





- The first checkpoint is the coordination and approval by the Kyiv City Council of a new edition of the Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025. The next two checkpoints are 2020 and 2025.
- The benchmarks for 2020 and 2025 are represented in the form of performance indicators that characterize the implementation of the Kyiv Development Strategy by the sectors of the city's development. It is important to note that, despite this binding, monitoring progress is carried out on an annual basis.

Tools for implementation of the Kyiv Development Strategy Until 2025:



- Describes the trends and main problems of the socio-economic development of Kviv
- Determines strategic and operational goals, development priorities for the relevant period, main tasks, stages and mechanisms for their implementation, performance monitoring and assessment system
- The Strategy implementation tool, which envisages measures in the medium term (from three to four years) within the tasks provided for by the Strategy
- Determines the responsible performers, terms of performance, volumes and sources of financing with the determination of performance indicators
- Is a basis for the development of investment programs (projects) aimed at the city's development
- Describes the prerequisites for the effective implementation of urban development projects and risks that could threaten successful implementation of the program
- Consists of a set of interrelated tasks and measures aimed at achieving the goals determined by the Strategy
- Is being implemented through individual development projects united by a a common goal and selected on a competitive basis
- A set of interconnected measures to address specific urban development issues
- Executed in the form of a document (in accordance with the form prescribed by the legislation), which determined joint actions of the project participants, as well as the resources necessary to achieve the project objectives within the established time frame

All of these Strategy implementation tools are used in close interaction to avoid duplication of measures envisaged by them. In addition, the results of their implementation from the point of view of achieving the goals of the Kyiv Development Strategy are continuously being compared.



Sources of financing the projects of the Kyiv Development Strategy:

1. Projects targeted at a specific group of residents

- Have a direct and significant effect on the life quality of a certain group of residents (e.g., thermomodernization of buildings, reconstruction / construction of new sports grounds, etc.)
- Provide for partial participation of residents in these projects (including financial participation)

2. Basic and socially-oriented projects

- Ensuring an appropriate life quality for the city's residents or create the conditions necessary for further attraction of investors and stimulation of business development (for example, reconstruction of infrastructure facilities)
- · Are not commercially attractive and financed at the expense of budget funds

3. Projects of national importance

- Have a nationwide effect and relate to subordinated state authorities, partly or completely do not relate to the city's powers (e.g., projects in cooperation with CEBs)
- Are financed from budget funds

4. Projects of high strategic priority and social significance

- City participation is necessary because of the high priority and social component in such projects (e.g., construction of private educational establishments)
- The city provides support with permits and acts as the guarantor of project risks
- Are commercially attractive and may involve mixed financing (budget and private)

5. Commercially attractive projects of strategic priority

- The city creates favourable conditions for the implementation of such projects (for example, the development of innovative growth points), creates a environment for getting permits and promotes projects among investors and business representatives
- · Financed by private funds of investors




